The 3rd Convocation of Gandhara University was held on April 13th in Shiraz Arena Hall, Peshawar Cantt. The Chief Minister of Khyber Pukhtoonkhwa, Mr. Justice Tariq Parvez was the Chief Guest on the occasion. Degrees were conferred upon Bachelors of Medicine, Surgery and Bachelors of Dentistry, from the session of 2011-2012. Pharma-D for the session of 2011 while Masters in Public Health was for session of 2012-2013. Faculty and students alike stood on the same platform for once, wearing graduate caps, gowns while their parents looked proudly upon them. The event was hosted by Dr. Ismail Qamar, Director Literary and Social Affairs.

After the beautiful recitation of the Holy Quran by Qari Abdur Rauf Madni, the Chancellor of Gandhara University Mrs. Roeeda Kabir declared the convocation open. Dr. Mumtaz Ahmed Principal KMC, took the oath from the graduates, taking their pledge to honestly and diligently serving humanity and their profession. Thereon, a total of 168 students were conferred with MBBS, BDS, Pharm-D and MPH degrees by the Chief Minister. A novel idea adopted by Gandhara University is fast gaining respect and admiration among its peers

Surprising all with a brilliant approach towards medicine, Gandhara University held a series of scientific seminars on April 5th and 6th. Day 1 was dedicated to the memory of some pioneering doctors of Peshawar whereas on Day 2 everyone got to choose the seminar more attuned to one's field and interest. The Scientific Committee was headed by Prof. Shaheed Iqbal while the focal person of the event was Dr. Jawad Ahmed Kundi, Director Medical Education Gandhara University.

Dr. Shahzad Akbar delivered an opening speech in memory of Gandhara University founder, Surgeon Muhammad Kabir. Dr. Akbar traced back history as to how Surgeon Kabir became the first doctor in Peshawar to introduce laproscopy, mastering the technology that many are still struggling to learn. Until his demise, Surgeon M. Kabir had performed nearly 200 successful laproscopies and is still regarded as one of the top most surgeons of the country.

Prof. Dr. Masood ur Rehman reminisced about his mentor and teacher Prof. Dr. Shams-ur-Rehman, a par excellence

Rheumatologist. Dr. Rehman belonged to the first batch (1960) of Khyber Medical College Peshawar and was one of those doctors who are workaholics to the extreme. While remembering Dr. Shams ur Rehman, he requested the administration of Gandhara University to pioneer and establish the first ever Rheumatology Department at Kabir Medical College. Lastly Prof. Imran Tajik talked highly of Prof. Dr. Umeed Akhtar Khan, former Principal of Khyber Medical College who became the first Principal of SBDC, after retiring as Principal of Khyber College of Dentistry.

The Chief Guest Professor Hafizullah, Vice Chancellor of Kabir Medical University delivered a welcome address in which he talked at length about research and its importance. He emphasised that research is "training to ask a question – a good, relevant, smart

question". Prof Dr. Hafizullah announced to the delight of many, the decision to establish the first Rheumatology Department at Kabir Medical College. He welcomed the participants to an under- and post-graduate series of lectures which began after tea. Many groups of students participated in setting up Clinic-tables comprising of research posters in the main corridors of the University. The 2nd Day lectures were delivered by consultants and senior Professors and were hence more subject-specific. As a student sums it up, "it was wonderful to hear the personal accounts of brilliant doctors while on the other hand, it was inspiring to learn about the scientific brains of some wonderful human beings".

Day 2 was divided into two speciality specific halves: that dedicated to Dentistry and the other to Medicine. Recognised Professors and renowned physicians and surgeons from Aga Khan Hospital Karachi, Rehman Medical Institute Peshawar, Khyber Medical College and Kabir Medical College presented insightful and knowledgeable lectures on varied subjects. Workshop on Dental Implants

A hands on clinical workshop is bound to provide a crash course to enrich, within a short time

Course directors Dr. Jawad Ahmad Kundi from the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Dr. Syed Nasir Shah from the Department of Prosthodontics delivered a brilliant hands-on clinical workshop. Held on 26th and 27th April, the course was meant to introduce Armamentarium (knowledge about use of specific surgical instruments), Guided Tissue Regeneration (GTR) and surgical protocols to young dentists.

GTR is required in periodontitis patients where there is excessive gum recession. Dental Implants though widely used nowadays are also meant to be properly understood and practiced before a medical practitioner adopts it. The workshop included lectures, hands-on exercises, live surgeries with certificates distributed in the end. With a house full response, many requested another workshop on the same topic in the near future!
